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Meet the stars at world premiere

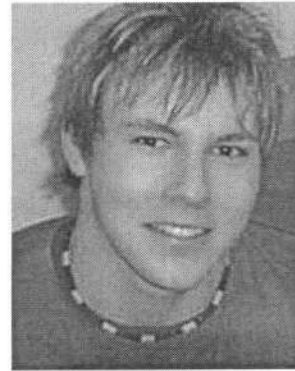
'Arizona Summer' features Scott Clifton of 'General Hospital'

Director Joey Travolta, producer Bill Blair and radio host Pam Stone are also expected; at press time, actress Morgan Fairchild wasn't confirmed.

"Arizona Summer" is set against that state's mountain and river scenery, and it features songs by Hoku and a score by contemporary Christian composer Edwin Willmington.
